Explain or describe questions – definitions will need to be learnt for all topics				
Explain questions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● make a point. ● give a reason why (often given as 'because') ● state the consequences (positive or negative) for the legal system. 				
Discuss questions: Aim to use five connectives to build analysis chains in a discuss question. Examples of connectives are 'because', 'leading to', 'therefore', 'however', 'the consequence' and 'as a result'.				
Evaluate is the top-level skill that is assessed in a GCSE Business exam. Evaluate questions look for respondents to form an opinion on a given issue and offer a critical response. Evaluate questions often require respondents to use knowledge relating to the topic area and wider knowledge of business to access the top-level marks. Evaluate questions are always linked to a case study and respondents must use this throughout to support their response. A conclusion is always necessary in an evaluate question.
